

Project and Program Tracking system

The operations of the African Capacity Building Foundation are in the areas of capacity building projects, programs and knowledge management activities in six core competence areas, namely, Economic Policy Analysis and Management, Financial Management and Accountability, Public Administration and Management, National Statistics, Policy Analysis Capacity of National Parliaments and Parliamentary Institutions, and Professionalization of the Voices of Civil Society and the Private Sector. The instruments for intervention consist of national and regional projects, country capacity building programs, FICAD grants, collaboration and exchange programs as well as knowledge generation and sharing activities. This tracking system provides information on the status of project and program proposals submitted to the Foundation. The aim is to provide a mechanism by which project promoters and other stakeholders can track progress in the processing of their requests for support by the Foundation.
