ACBF'S INVESTMENTS IN ESWATINI

The Foundation's investment in the Kingdom of Eswatini, to date has reached about US\$4.11 million. ACBF is proud to have supported human and institutional development in the country. This support has gone to several institutions covering the public sector and civil society organizations. With this support from ACBF, these institutions have become more valuable and are playing significant roles in the country's development agenda.

ESWATINI'S CONTRIBUTION TO ACBF

The Foundation has benefitted immensely from the African and global political influence of the Kingdom of Eswatini. The country has over the years contributed significantly to ACBF, and to date has made a cumulative contribution of US\$0.75 Million.

With the support of the Kingdom of Eswatini, the African capacity Building Foundation has been able to leverage resources from the international community to support capacity development across Africa and to achieve significant results in support of the continent's development process. Notably, ACBF has been catalyzing change in Africa by investing in capacity development initiatives in the public and private sectors and in civil society organizations; providing technical assistance in implementation of capacity development interventions; generating, managing and sharing knowledge on best practices in capacity building and development management.

The Foundation has strengthened public policy across Africa, produced highly-skilled public sector economists and managers, strengthened institutions of financial accountability and enhanced the effectiveness of non-state actors. ACBF has also supported the creation of platforms for dialogue on, and coordination in capacity development, supported improvements in trade and regional integration, empowered women and strengthened parliaments.

ANNEX 2: SUCCESS STORIES

Recognizing the need for more effective, well-informed policies and management of the economy, in the Kingdom of Eswatini, the African capacity Building Foundation, stepped in to support the Government in the establishment of a Policy Centre, named the Eswatini Economic Policy Analysis and Research Centre (ESEPARC), back then in 2008. The broad context for the establishment of ESEPARC was to respond to the poor performance of the economy of Eswatini during the 1990s and 2000s. ESEPAC would be used by the government institutions responsible for various aspects of economic policy formulation and implementation, as well as the private sector and civil society.

The goal of this project was to build sustainable national capacity in order to improve the quality and timeliness of public policies in the Kingdom of Eswatini through the establishment of a semi-autonomous economic Policy and Research Centre, conducting of research in areas of policy formulation and management, the provision of training and policy advice to government officials and the promotion of policy dialogue within Swaziland through dissemination workshops, conferences and publications.

Thanks to ACBF, Eswatini had its first ever think tank. ACBF support to the establishment of ESEPARC included technical support for the institution to run efficiently and with integrity to produce evidence-based research output to inform the country's development process. ACBF also ensured that ESEPARC recruited well qualified staff, and the organization was supported with the right financial and administrative systems, to ensure a strong and efficient financial, monitoring and evaluation system.

Since its establishment, ESEPARC has continued to play a central and most important role in Eswatini's policy framework. The think tank is geared towards providing quality research, tangible evidence, and reliable information to address Eswatini's most pressing issues such as strategies to create and maintain sustainable jobs and improve the levels of business and consumer confidence.

ESEPARC has taken the lead in building the capacity of government institutions, the private sector, and the civil society in the Kingdom of Eswatini. The Think Tank remains instrumental in promotion of continued collaboration between government, business, labor, and civil society as key to growing the economy and creating jobs. ESEPARC supports Government's efforts to create and implement its national programs and policies and remains a reputable research and policy centre in the country.
